

How to print a temporary ID card or request a replacement ID card on myuhc.com®

After becoming a UnitedHealthcare member, the quickest way to print a temporary ID card or request a replacement ID card is to go online to myuhc.com.

1. Simply go to myuhc.com, log in (or register if it's your first time visiting the site).
2. Once on your home page, click on the "Account Settings" link located at the top of the page.
3. Under "My Account Settings", select the option to print a temporary ID card or request a new ID card by postal mail.
4. Follow the easy directions via the site to submit or print.
