The following is a list of seasonal work gear required on a Savanna Drilling Rig. Savanna Drilling supplies all rig employees with coveralls and a hard hat.

Below is a list of supplies that an employee will be required to provide based on the accommodations provided at the rig. There are three types of accommodations that a drilling rig may have: Texas Camp, Non-Camp, Full Camp.

Texas Camp: These camps are typically located nearby the rig location. Crews are responsible for supplying their own bedding, cooking supplies, groceries and toiletries. While staying at a Texas camp, a daily allowance is provided for food and toiletries. The living allowance is paid out on your pay cheque based on days worked, therefore you will need to be able to pay for your food and toiletries out of your own pocket.

Texas Camp (Non-Catered Camp) Supply List

- Minimum 10 Day supply of food & water, condiments, tupperware containers
- Twin size bedding (blanket & pillow)
- Towels
- Toiletry Items (shaving cream, razor, deodorant, tooth brush, floss, shampoo, soap)
- Paper or plastic plates, knives, forks, spoons
- Frying pan, pot, cookie sheet
- Phone charger
- Spare tire with tools
- Emergency Roadside Kit, Tow Rope, First Aid Kit (Recommended)

Non-Camp: When the rig site is near a town, non-camp conditions normally apply. Crews will stay in hotel rooms and receive a per day living allowance for food and accommodation. The living allowance is paid out on your pay cheque based on days worked, therefore you will need to be able to pay for your food and accommodation out of your own pocket.

Full-Camp: When a rig site is in a remote location, crews may stay in a full camp. In a full-camp all food and full accommodation is provided. Once at the camp, the crew travels to and from the rig in the crew truck.
